Adults who care. Middle School advisors are extraordinarily tuned in to students and go above and beyond to provide support. Students meet with their advisors to keep schoolwork on track, share concerns, or just talk.





Art is everywhere. And Catalina students are getting noticed: Middle School students regularly take home a slew of awards at the Scholastic Art Awards. Our students also explore sound and music theory and have the option of taking private instrument or voice lessons.

Powerful questions. They ground the Middle School curriculum. By digging deep, asking and answering, students find meaning in complex concepts and begin to more fully understand their place in the world.
